The First Century Church #3 – “The Believers are Persecuted” Acts 5:12-42

WEEK OF:

MAIN TRUTH: The Holy Spirit will help you to have peace in times of trouble.

TO DO AS THE CHILDREN ARRIVE:

1. Greet the children; make them feel welcome.
2. Take attendance.
3. Listen to previous week’s memory verse.
4. Have children put money in missions bank.
5. Have children put candy corn in their team’s container according to the number of points earned.

PRE-SESSION ACTIVITY:

1. OLDER CHILD: “Shape Your Faith!”
2. YOUNGER CHILD: “When Should You Believe God?”

PRAYER: (4 minutes)

1. Prayer song: _____
2. Review the **WHEN WE PRAY IN CLUB** Chart. Explain the **PATTERN FOR PRAYER** Chart. (See attached visual.)
3. Lead the class in prayer. Be sure to include your “Thank You Prayers” and “Please Prayers.” Let the children say, “*Dear Heavenly Father*” and “*In Jesus’ name, Amen*” with you.

MEMORY VERSE: (7 minutes)

John 14:27 – “*Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto You . . . Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.*”

(The underlined portion of the verse indicates what the younger children should memorize. See “**Involvement Helps for Younger Children**” for helps in teaching the verse to the younger children.)

“**Solo Word**” – After you have read this verse from the Bible, explained what it means, and repeated it at least two times, you may begin this drill. Choose a child to select any word from the verse to be his “solo word.” When the group repeats the verse together, that child alone will say his “solo word.” He keeps his “solo word” and another child chooses another word to be his solo. Children continue choosing “solo words” and saying the verse.

COUNSEL TIME:

(If you have a helper, hostess, or Teacher Junior Grade, let them do the review time while you counsel those who responded to the invitation. Otherwise, at the end of club, be sure to remind them to stay for a few minutes so you can counsel them.)

TAKE TIME TO REVIEW/QUIET TIME NOTEBOOK: (1 minute)

From the returned TTtR/Q.T.N.s, mention one or two of the children's responses to the Main Truth challenge. Hand out Take Time to Review/Quiet Time Notebook, The First Century Church #3. Ask the children to complete the booklet before the next club. Remind them that they need to show you their TTtR/Q.T. Notebook next week.

LEARNING ABOUT THE BIBLE & THE OLD TESTAMENT BOOKS: (5 minutes)

Teach information for Week #3.

MISSIONARY TIME: (13 minutes)

1. Sing "God's Way" while a child comes to look in the "Go and Tell" Box.
2. Share information for the "Go and Tell" Box – Week #2 and pray. (See attached page.)
3. Show goal chart and mention the amount given so far.
4. Missions song: _____
5. Story: *No Darkness At All*. Teach the part of the story for Week #3/4.

REVIEW ACTIVITY: (6 minutes)

Use the activity of your choice or the Bible Learning Game from "Involvement Helps for Younger Children."

Review questions for THE FIRST CENTURY CHURCH #3:

1. **What is the Temple?** (The building where Jewish people could go to worship God and to learn about Him)
2. **Name the three Persons of God.** (God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit)
3. **Which Person of God lived in each believer and helped them to do some amazing things?** (The Holy Spirit)
4. **Many people were coming to Jerusalem for the disciples to help them. What kind of people were they?** (Sick people who wanted to be healed)
5. **Why did the Sadducees have the disciples arrested and thrown into prison?** (To try to stop them from preaching about Jesus)
6. **The disciples were persecuted. What does "persecuted" mean?** (To be treated badly for believing in Jesus and for telling others about Him)
7. **What were the disciples warned to stop doing?** (Telling people about Jesus)
8. **How did the disciples get out of prison?** (An angel of the Lord came and opened the gates of the prison)
9. **What did the Temple guards find when they arrived at the prison?** (The prison door was shut and locked, prison guards were standing watch, but the disciples were gone)
10. **What wise advice did Gamaliel give to the council?** ("Be careful what you are planning to do to these men. Leave them alone. Let them go.")
11. **How did the disciples feel about being able to suffer for Jesus?** (They rejoiced)
12. **Did the disciples stop telling people about Jesus even though they were threatened?** (No)




Find the letter in each shape to discover something each one of us should do.





John 14:27

INTRODUCE THE VERSE:

Think about a time when you had a terrible problem or went through something that was hard or difficult. During that time were you afraid? Worried? Unsure what to do? We all go through times like that in our lives, but when we do, God wants us to have peace. What is peace and how can we have it? Listen carefully to our memory verse for today . . .

READ THE VERSE:

Read the verse together from the visualized verse. Then read the verse directly from the Bible.

EXPLAIN THE VERSE:

John 14:27

– This is where the verse is found in the Bible. We call it the address or reference. It is found in the book of John, chapter 14, verse 27.

“Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto You”

– Peace is quietness in your heart or a calmness on the inside. When you know Jesus as your Saviour, God wants to give you peace even when you are going through a hard or difficult time.

“. . .”

– These dots mean there are more words to the verse, but we are not going to learn them today.

“Let not your heart be troubled,”

– When we are going through hard or difficult times, God doesn’t want us to feel worried or upset inside. Instead, He wants us to have peace.

“neither let it be afraid.”

– Just as God doesn’t want us to be troubled inside, He also doesn’t want us to be afraid. No matter what hard thing is happening in our lives, we can be sure that God is with us and will help us by doing what is best.

REPEAT THE VERSE:

“Solo Word” – After you have read this verse from the Bible, explained what it means, and repeated it at least two times, you may begin this drill. Choose a child to select any word from the verse to be his “solo word.” When the group repeats the verse together, that child alone will say his “solo word.” He keeps his “solo word” and another child chooses another word to be his solo. Children continue choosing “solo words” and saying the verse.

Memory Verse

For younger children, teach only the underlined portion of the verse.

John 14:27 – “Peace” I leave with you, My peace I give unto You . . . Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.”

Bible Lesson Involvement Helps

Flashcard 3-2:

Have children pretend to be carrying someone on a stretcher.

Have children make an angry look on their face.

Have children repeat the word “persecuted.”

Flashcard 3-3:

Have children show a thumbs up if they think the disciples will keep telling people about Jesus. Have children show a thumbs down if they think the disciples will not keep telling people about Jesus.

Flashcard 3-4:

Have children put their hand over their eyes and look around as if looking for the missing disciples.

Flashcard 3-5:

Have children shake their pointer finger angrily and repeat, “Didn’t we order you never to teach in Jesus’ name?”

Have children make an angry look on their face.

Have children nod their heads in agreement.

Bible Learning Game


Have children sit in a circle on the floor. Pass a beanbag (a soft ball or rolled up sock will also work) around the circle while singing the words below to the tune of “Deep and Wide.”

“Have His peace. Have His peace,
God wants you to always have His peace.
Have His peace. Have His peace,

When the song is finished, say to the children, “The followers of Jesus were going through a hard time in our story today. Even children have times of trouble.” Then ask the child holding the beanbag, “(Child’s name), what does God the Holy Spirit want you to have during times of trouble?” Allow child to answer. Then say, “Peace is a quietness in your heart or a calmness on the inside for people who know Jesus as their Saviour.” Repeat as time allows, giving other children a chance to be the one holding the beanbag at the end of the song.

LEARNING ABOUT THE BIBLE & THE OLD TESTAMENT BOOKS

WEEK #3



(Place figure #1.) Do you know how many books are in the Bible? Yes, the Bible has 66 books in it, and it is divided into two parts. *(Place figure #10.)* The first part is the Old Testament and has 39 books in it. *(Place figure #11.)* The second part of the Bible is the New Testament, and it has 27 books in it. *(Place figure #12.)* So the Bible is a book of books. The word *Testament* means “agreement” or “promise.” The Old Testament tells us that God promised the Saviour would come. The New Testament tells us that God kept His promise—the Saviour (Jesus) did come. *(Place figure #17.)* There are three reasons why God gave us the Old and New Testaments: 1) To learn about God. *(Place figure #18.)* 2) To believe in Jesus. *(Place figure #19.)* 3) To know right from wrong. *(Place figure #20.)* Everything in the Bible is the correct record of what God wants you to know and do. The more you read the Bible, the more you know what are the right things for you to do. I am thankful to have a copy of the Bible to study so that I can tell you about God and the Lord Jesus.



GO AND TELL BOX

WEEK #2 – EARNING MISSION MONEY

It is important that children understand when they are young how God wants us to share so that other children can hear about Jesus also. When you teach missions and talk about bringing an offering for the missionaries, it is important to help the children understand that they should be willing to give some of their own money. Share with them that we do not want them just to go home and ask their parents/guardians, etc. for money. We are giving to help support the missionaries we sponsor in the club ministry.

The list below will provide you with some ideas that you can share with your clubbers to help them know how they can earn their own money to give in the missionary offering.
(Choose those appropriate for your clubbers.)

1. Weed gardens or flower beds.
2. Help wash cars.
3. Pick up trash in the neighbor's yard and help them put it out.
4. Rake leaves and pick up twigs that fall in the yard.
5. Wash windows.
6. Babysit. (Children too young to babysit can entertain younger boy or girls while their mothers are busy working.)
7. Address Christmas cards.
8. Wrap Christmas presents.
9. Clean a garage.
10. Collect and recycle aluminum cans.
11. Shovel snow off walks or decks.
12. Fold laundry.
13. Take the neighbor's mail and newspaper in while they are away.
14. Water plants and lawns when neighbor is away
15. Make and sell cookies.
16. Help a younger child, with their homework.
17. Run errands for an older person.
18. Help an older person carry their groceries.

 - Sick people started coming in from other towns to be healed.

 - More and more sick people were coming to be healed. Every one of them was healed.
 - People who had been sick must have been happy to be well again. Disc. must have been happy to see God doing such wonderful miracles.
 - Not everyone was happy about what was happening in Jerus.
 - Religious leaders, Sadducees, were not happy. In fact, they were filled w/anger. They did not want people to hear about Jes.
 - To try to stop them from preaching, Sad. had the disc. arrested. & put in prison. Warned them to stop what they're doing.

- Discipl. were being persecuted.
 - Persec. means to be treated badly for believing in Jesus and for telling others about Him.
 - Disc. being persec. They were thrown into prison and warned to stop telling others about Jesus

- Disciples were in a time of trouble. Had been thrown in prison, warned to stop telling others about J.
 - God gave them message through angel. He wanted them to keep telling ppl. about Jesus.
 - Would the disciples do that?
 - God gave the disciples the courage they needed to obey.

- Early the next morning, disc. went to Temple and started teaching the people about Jesus as they were told.

- Relig. leaders met together for meeting called a council

-Order was given to bring the disc. from prison to meeting.

- The guards rushed to the prison right away to get them

FLASHCARD 3-4

- When guards arrived at prison, door was shut and locked, prison guards were outside keeping watch.

- When Temple guards went into prison, the disc. were gone.
- Temple guards must have been shocked!
- Hurried back to inform those at the meeting what they'd seen.
- "Prison was securely locked. Guards were standing outside. But when we opened doors, no one was there!"
- They were prob. all confused. Must have wondered what had happened and wondered what to do next.
- Then, someone came w/ news
- "Men you put in prison are standing in the Temple. They are teaching the people."
- Captain and other Temple guards hurried to Temple to get the disciples. Brought them to stand before the council.

FLASHCARD 3-5

- High priest confronted disc....
- "Didn't we order you never to teach in J. name? You have filled Jer. w/your teachings, and you are determined to blame His death on us."
- Relig. leaders didn't want to hear they were responsible for Jesus' death.
